
Herb Keinon, Diplomatic Correspondent, The Jerusalem Post:

Mumbai - in Memoriam

Toasts are most often offered on happy occasions but today's is in sad remembrance of a shockingevent. Ttoday is the yahrzeit (memorial day) for two devoted people, who in 2003 founded and

operated The Nariman House, the first Chabad House, in Mumbai, India. They were killed



when heavily armed Muslim militants stormed the building and killed six people inside during attacks on the city in 2008.

The house, which is tucked away down a narrow lane in the bustling area of Colaba market, was established as an open house for visiting Jews and the local community.

The Nariman House reopened on Tuesday, August 26, 2014, nearly six years after the horrific event. It was one of several high-profile targets assaulted by the gunmen. It was left bullet-ridden and its directors, Rabbi Gavriel Holtzberg and his pregnant wife Rivka, were killed. They were among 166 people killed in the three-day on-

slaught in November 2008, which also targeted luxury hotels, a popular cafe and a train station.

The refurbished five-story Nariman House has a synagogue, a cafeteria and a function room for the Jewish community. The top two floors, due to be turned into a museum, have been left bearing



the damage from bullets and grenades as a reminder of the tragedy.

In the synagogue, candles mark the spot where Rabbi Holtzberg was shot. Pictures of him, his wife and their surviving young child adorn the stairwells.

While they were among six people taken hostage and killed by the gunmen, their young son, then aged two, was plucked to safety by his Indian nanny.

With sincere wishes that their city, and the entire world, should never again witness such an event,

let's raise our glasses to President Veena Rattanchand Murarka and the 73 members of the Rotary Club of Mumbai South. They are

End Polio Now

Miles to end polio: \$6 million crosses the finish line for polio eradication

Rotary General Secretary John Hewko and six Rotray International staff members bicycled 104 miles in Tucson, Arizona on Saturday, for the Miles to End Polio event, raising more than \$1.7 million for polio eradication.

The money raised by Rotary will receive a two-toone match from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, totaling roughly \$3.4 million. The team surpassed its original fundraising goal of \$1 million. In addition to the team from Evanston, 100 Rotary member riders took part in the ride, and raised more than \$6 million to end polio.

The fundraising ride is part of the annual El Tour de Tucson bike event in Tucson, Arizona, USA. The race attracts more than 9,000 cyclists a year, making it one of the



top cycling events in the U.S. The Rotary team from Evanston was joined by Rotary members from Arizona's District 5500, and other members from around the world.

Hewko tweeted that he finished the race in 5 hours and 2 minutes.
