- On September 3, 1940 the German Sicherheitsdienst (SD) under Reinhard Heydrich officially bann
 Masons, Rotary and the Red Cross, although Rotary Germany had voluntarily dissolved itself in 19
- On September 4, 1998 Google is formally incorporated by Larry Page and Sergey Brin, two student University only 20 years ago!!!!
- On September 5, 1750 a decree was issued in Paderborn, Prussia, that allows for annual search of homes for stolen or doubtful goods



- On September 6, 1954 the great Italian movie 'La Strada', directed by Frederico Fellini and starring Quinn, premiers at the Venice Film Festival
- On September 8, 1504 Michelangelo' statue of David was unveiled in Firenze (Florence), Italy
- On September 9, 1543. Mary Stuart (probably an ancestor of our dear fellow Rotarian Geert) at 9 crowned 'Queen of Scots' in Stirling
