


This Week's Programme

R/Tony Kolankiewicz, U.S. Military and USFSO (ret.):

"From Genocide in Southeast Asia to Resurrection in Eastern Europe"

Fellow club member Tony Kolankiewicz will talk about two postings that bookended his time with the US Department of State.





88) required extensive travel, which seemed like a real-life adventure novel: military invasion; espionage; artillery bombardment; visits to refugee camps in Indonesia and along the Thai-Cambodian border; a stint as Deputy Chief of Mission in Vientiane, and more. Fun times!

Tony's final Foreign Service assignment in Warsaw (2008-2012) saw him persuading the Polish Government to accept deployment of a US missile defense system and to increase Poland's troop contribution to NATO in Afghanistan. He succeeded on both counts; he also succeeded in identifying his Polish genealogical roots. He and his wife, Carmen, traveled widely around the country, inadvertently discovering in the process the rich Jewish legacy of pre-World War II and its revival of that legacy in modern-day Poland.

In between these postings, Tony participated in the transformation of post-revolutionary Romania, served as Deputy Chief of Mission in Bru-



nei, and learned first-hand that the job of Political-Military Chief at the American Embassy in Moscow really is the most complex and complicated political-military assignment in the US Foreign Service.

The presentation will be informal, unclassified, and unofficially personal. Any reference to actual persons, living or dead, is strictly coincidental.

Brunei

Tony's adventures took him to the Sultanate of Brunei (officially "The Nation of Brunei, the Abode of Peace") - a sovereign state located on the north coast of the island of Borneo in South-

east Asia. It is separated into two parts by the Malaysian Sarawak district of Limbang. Brunei's population was 408,786 in July 2012.

At the peak of the Bruneian Empire, Sultan Bolkiah (reigned 1485–1528) is alleged to have had control

over most regions of Borneo, as well as the Sulu archipelago off the northeast tip of Borneo and Seludong (Manila). The maritime state was visited by Spain's Magellan Expedition in 1521.

During the 19th century, the Bruneian Empire began ceded Sarawak to James Brooke and installed him as the White Rajah, and it ceded Sabah to the British North Borneo Chartered Company. In 1888, Brunei became a British protec-



torate. After the Japanese occupation during World War II, in 1959 a new constitution was written. In 1962, a small armed rebellion against the monar-

chy was ended with the help of the British.

Brunei gained its independence from the United Kingdom on 1 January 1984. Economic growth during the 1990s and 2000s transformed Brunei into an industrialised country based on extensive petroleum and natural gas fields.

Brunei has the second-highest Human Development Index among the Southeast Asian nations, after Singapore, and is classified as a "developed country". According to the IMF, Brunei is ranked fifth in the world by gross domestic product per capita at purchasing power parity. In 2011 that Brunei had a public debt at 0% of the national GDP.

















Jerusalem Rotary Club
