International Toast - Club Rotario de Panama

Do you know the origin of the word: Leotard? I assume not. Below please find the answer and information on other historical events during the coming calendar week, November 12 to 18::

 On November 12, 1859 Jules Leotard performs 1st Flying Trapeze circus act in Paris, France. He also designed a garment for his activity that bears his name until this day







- On November 14, 1977 Egyptian President Anwar Sadat repeats willingness to visit Israel to Walter Cronkite. A few days later, on November 17 President Sadat accepted Israel's invitation for the visit
- On November 15, 1660 First kosher butcher (Asser Levy) licensed in New Amsterdam (now New York City)
- On November 16, 1969 The 1968 Mỹ Lai massacre of between 347 and 504 unarmed South Vietnamese civilians by US soldiers is first reported. This marked a turning point in public awareness and criticism of the Vietnam War
- On November 16, 1841 Napoleon Guerin of New York City patented the life jacket, two layers of fabric with cork material in-between. This relative simple invention saved uncountable lives until today
- On November 17, 1913 The first ship sailed through the Panama Canal, which connects the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. A milestone in reducing shipping times and reaching the Pacific Coast of North and South America from the Atlantic Ocean







The Panama Canal is an artificial 82 km waterway in Panama that connects the Atlantic Ocean with the Pacific Ocean. France began work on the canal in 1881, but stopped due to engineering problems and a high worker mortality rate. The United States took over the project in 1904 and opened the canal on August 15, 1914. Canal locks are at each end to lift ships up to Gatun Lake, an artificial lake created to reduce the amount of excavation work required for the canal, 26 m above sea level, and then lower the ships at the other end. The original locks are 34 m wide. A third, wider lane of locks was constructed between September 2007 and May 2016. The expanded canal began commercial operation on June 26, 2016. By 2012, more than 815,000 vessels had passed through the canal. It takes 11.38 hours to pass through the Panama Canal. The American Society of Civil Engineers has ranked the Panama Canal one of the seven wonders of the modern world.
