

The Rotary Club of Girona, Spain

On the 11th of May, 1904, Salvador Dali was born as the son of a notary in Figueras, a small city on




the Costa del Brava in Catalonia, North of Barcelona.



"The Persistence of Memory"

Salvador Dali studied at the Art Academy of Madrid, leaving Spain in 1927 to go to Paris, where he met Picasso and the circle of surrealists, including Joan Miro and André Breton. He met his wife and main inspiration, Gala, making a home in Port Lligat near Cadacques in Girona Province. 1936 they left Spain, for Italy, and 1940 they went to New

York where Dali had a major exhibition of more than 40 Paintings at the MOMA (Museum of Modern Art). Influenced by the old masters of the Italian Renaissance Dali painted using their techniques but with surrealistic subject matter, full of fantastic situations and figures. In 1970 he began

work on his own museum in Figueras which he designed and hung, personally, as a work of art in its own right. 1989 Dali died in Figueras and he is buried there under the

geodesic dome of his museum.

There is a Rotary club in Figueres but their website has not been updated since 2010/2011, so

the club of Girona, the capital of the Province of Girona, Catalonia, was chosen.



Girona, a city of about 100,000, is a central hub for tourists visiting the Costa Brava and Barcelona. The administrative and economic center of the region, it boasts a beautiful cathedral and many historic buildings.

The **Rotary Club of Girona** was founded on 29 December 1980 as a part of District 2202. It has about 50 members who meet every Thursday at 9 pm at the Hotel Carlemany. This year's president is Joan Gallardo.

Among the club's many activities are an annual golf tournament; part of which involves 10 members of the club dressing in curious

costumes and wandering about the city selling tickets to raise money for the foundation
