Ambassador (Ret.) Ram Aviram, former Israeli ambassador to Greece:

"Israel-Greece Relations in Turbulent Times"

Retired Ambassador Ram Aviram served over 25 years in high-ranking positions at the Israeli Foreign Ministry, including Chief of Staff of Shimon Peres, long-term service in Europe and Asia, and ambassador to Greece from 2003 to 2006. During this latter period, Israel withdrew from Gaza, the center-right Nea Demokratia took power and Greece hosted the Olympic Games. The period marked the speedy development in the relations between the two countries. Since then, Ram maintains intensive relations in Greece and follows closely developments there.



His career at the Ministry was also highly connected to hydro-politics and water related issues.

Since his retirement, Ram is the lead consultant of BIT – Consultancy, a multidisciplinary agency active in cross-boundary water interactions. BIT is the geo-political consultant for the Rehabilitation of the Lower Jordan River Project and the Red Sea-Dead Sea Water Project, among many others.

Ram is a lecturer at Haifa University and Tel-Hai Academic College. He is a founding member of Israel Desalination Association and member of the board of Waterfronts Israel Water Industry Association.




International Toast

Athens

Today, Wednesday June 24, our presentation will be about Israel-Greece relations. On this occa-

sion we will toast the first Rotary Club of Greece, The Athinai Rotary Club. In 1928 Jim Davidson, the Special Commissioner for Rotary Extension, began his tour of the Middle and Far East.



After an unsuccessful attempt to establish a Rotary club in Istanbul, Jim Davidson flew to Athens on Novem-

ber 18, 1928. In less than a month he found enough business and professional men to come together to organise a Rotary Club. This brought together men of sharply divided political opinions, both Royalists and Republicans, under the presidency of Spiro Loverdos, one of the leading bankers in Athens at the time. The charter membership was entirely Greek, unlike many of Da-

vidson's other clubs that had a varied national and ethnic mix. The charter was presented and

the club formally received into Rotary on January 30, 1929.

After Athens Davidson



flew to Cairo, Jerusalem, where he established our club, and on to Bombay, Burma, Malaysia and Indonesia, where he succeeded in organizing a number of Rotary Clubs.

The **Rotary Club of Athinai**, District no. 2470, is the oldest and biggest club in Greece and in the Balkan Area. It is one of the first 100 Clubs in Europe and in the East Mediterranean.

The Club has 115 members and meets ever Tuesday at 21:00 at the Royal Olympic Hotel, on Athanasiou Diakou 28, across from the Zeus temple.
