We then need a couple of days to recuperate !

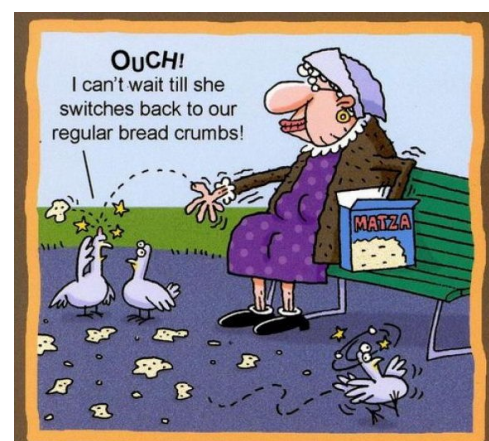
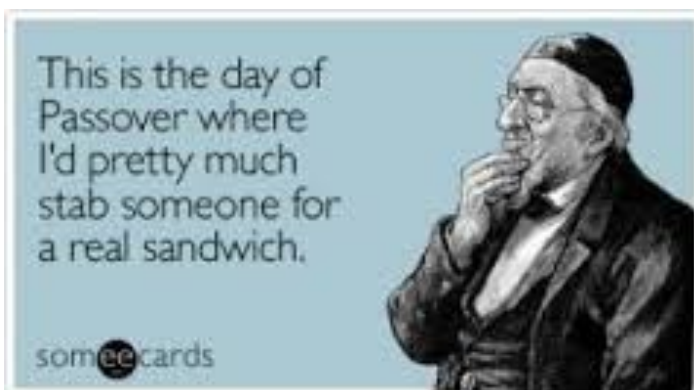
Many of our friends, are celebrating Easter or Pascha, with many festivities, which starting yesterday with Palm Sunday!

Still silenced, excluded, behind closed doors.

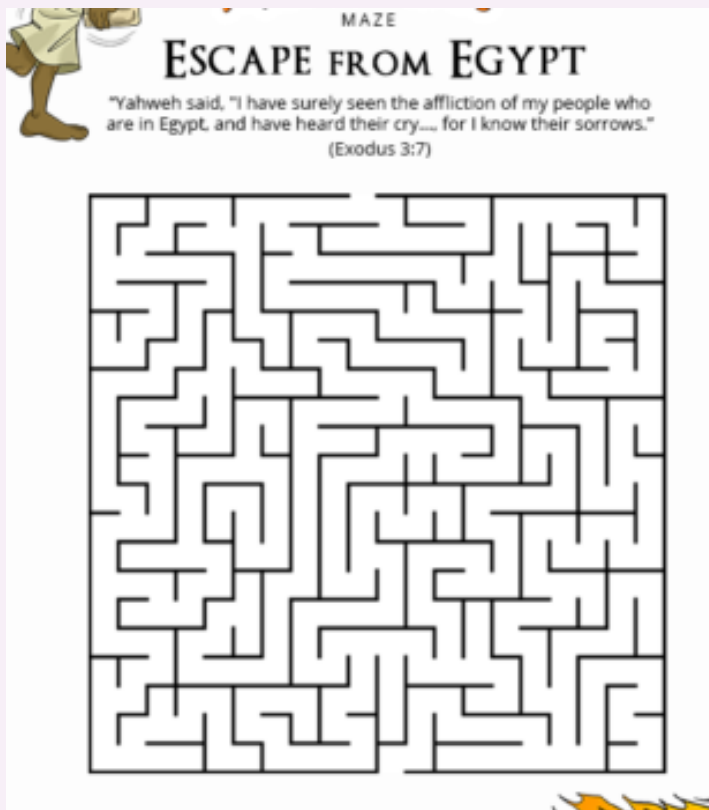
And now is the time to put things back in order.

we so long, and never, ever, pass a woman over again.

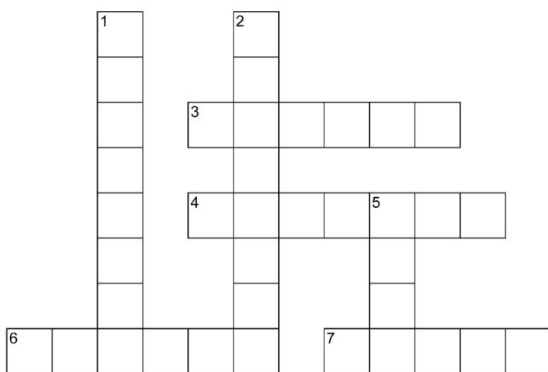


RELAXATION PLAYING TIME

ACROSS

- 3 Vegetables, which are dipped into salt water to represent the tears and pain of Jewish slaves in Egypt
- 4 Roasted egg, symbolizes mourning
- 6 Three matzohs; represent the unleavened bread the Jewish people took with them when they left Egypt
- 7 Bitter herbs; symbolizes bitterness of slavery

DOWN

- 1 Sweet, brown, pebbly mixture, representing the mortar used by Jewish slaves to build storehouses in Egypt
- 2 Bitter herbs; symbolizes bitterness of slavery
- 5 Roasted lamb shankbone; represents the korban or sacrificial lamb

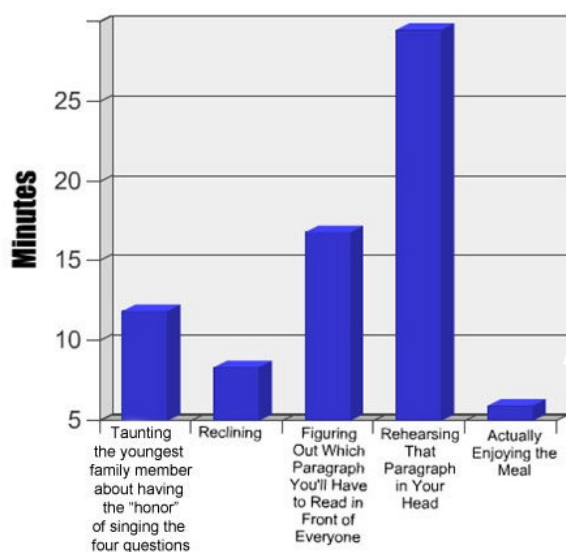
