Orly Wahba was born and bred in Brooklyn, NY. In March 2018, her life-long dream to live in Jerusalem finally became a reality.

Orly is an educator, entrepreneur, author, inspirational speaker and community activist passionate about motivating people to be the best that they can.

Orly began as a Middle School educator at the Yeshiva of Flatbush, teaching the children to use the power they have to influence the world for good.

Yearning to make a larger impact with her philanthropic work Orly founded Life Vest Inside in 2011, a non-profit organization with a mission to inspire, empower and educate people of all backgrounds to lead a life of kindness. Orly's film, Kindness Boomerang went viral reaching more than 100 million people globally - landing her a spot to speak at TED. In 2017, she published her first book, "Kindness Boomerang" to help make Kindness infectious. She created and runs Dance for Kindness, also to this end.

Orly has hopes and dreams of infusing positive change in the political arena by focusing on ethics, character and values.

Orly attended Trapeze School NYC, directed community theater, plays drums and piano, figure skates, plays basketball, softball and ping pong. She received her BA in Film Production and English from Brooklyn College, and her MA in Jewish History from Touro College.

District Semi-annual Conference

The conference was held in Kfar Yoanah on Friday 11th January. The event was attended by over 500 Rotarians from all parts of the country, a turnout of 50% of all members in the District. District Governor Alon Bendet in his presentation of the activities of the past half year and plans for the remaining six months, was consistently upbeat and optimistic for growth and activities. In his report he commented:

- That a 7th Rotary Peace Centre was to be opened at the Negev Arava Research Institute..
- That the Annual District Conference would be held in Jerusalem on 17 March 2019 preceding the 90th Anniversary Gala.

- That members should attend the Zeltner Prize ceremony in Tel Aviv as it was an important event.
- That so far this year 4 new clubs had been established and 110 new members registered."Good. But not good enough."
- "The Debate" a competition in English for competitors from non-English speaking countries with the final to be held in Israel to be initiated. This will mirror the Young Speaker competition that the District runs for Hebrew and Arabic speakers.

After a compelling presentation by Dr. Guy Bechor, "We are in a Turbulent Middle East," prizes were awarded to clubs for achievements in a number of areas.



7 January 1785 1st balloon flight across English Channel by Jean Pierre Blanchard and John Jeffries from Dover UK to Guine, near Calais, France

8 January, 1867 African American men granted the right to vote in Washington, D.C. despite President Andrew Johnson's veto

- **10 January 1863** 1st underground railway opens in London
- 11 January, 1571 Emperor Maximilian II grants Austrian nobility freedom of religion
- 12 January 1971 US Federal grand jury indicts Rev Philip Berrigan & 5 others, including a nun and 2 priests, on charges of plotting to kidnap Henry Kissinger
- 13 January 1404 The Act of Multipliers is passed by the English Parliament forbidding alchemists to use their knowledge to create precious metals (it was feared that if any alchemist should succeed it would bring ruin upon the state)

Today we toast the Rotary Club of Dover on the remarkable first flight in a balloon across the English Channel from Dover to France. RC Dover was founded in 1922, following the establishment of Rotary Clubs in Canterbury, Margate and Ramsgate. Blanchard and Jeffries had too much equipment in the basket. They dumped everything, even Blanchard's trousers but kept hold of a letter, the world's first airmail. They completed the flight in two-and-ahalf hours. Only a short time earlier on 21 November 1783, Pilatre de Rozier succeeded in the first manned balloon flight for 28 minutes and reached a height of 3,000 feet.

Today we toast the Miami Rotary Club on the first recorded snowfall in their city 42 years ago. The Rotary Club of Miami is the fifth oldest Rotary Club in Florida, having received its charter on 1st March 1917, after being sponsored by the Rotary Club of Jacksonville. One of their main activities is sponsoring scholarships for school students. They meet for lunch on Thursdays in the Miami Yacht Club.

Mahatma Gandhi in South Africa! The National Day of 'Down Under' (occasionally called Australia) and other remarkable events remembered.

21 January 1934 Parisian baker and "student of medieval life" Henri Littière appears in court charged with forcing his adulterous wife Juliette to wear a chastity belt. Having committed the same offence in 1932, he was sentenced to three months in prison and fined 50 francs for cruelty to his wife

22 January 1908 Katie Mulcahey is arrested for lighting a cigarette, violating the 1-day old "Sullivan Ordinance" banning women from smoking in public and is fined \$5. Appearing before the judge she stated "I've got as much right to smoke as you have. I never heard of this new law. No man shall dictate to me."

23 January 1973 US President Richard Nixon announces that an accord had been reached to end the Vietnam War

24 January 1857 University of Calcutta founded as the first university in South Asia

26 January 1788 Captain Arthur Philip and British colonists hoist the Union Flag at Sydney Cove, New South Wales, now celebrated as Australia Day

The Community Services Committee continues this tradition to this very day and has a proud record of the earlier Matching Grants projects and now with the Global Grants as well as many smaller grants for community needs as these are identified. In 1989/90, Yossi Cassuto was Club President. With his Swedish connections he learnt that Sweden was upgrading its hospitals and was getting rid of equipment that was still in perfect condition. He managed to arrange the transfer of a container load to Yad Sara worth US\$60,000. The photograph shows Yossi, in elegant blazer and red tie, together with fellow Rotarians and staff from Yad Sara, when the medical equipment, that included wheel chairs and other aids to help the disabled, was handed over. A very successful and worthy project.
