Mitchell Barak,

Founder: Keevoon Global Research, Ltd, Jerusalem

Topic: "Exciting Israeli Political Developments - Local and National"

Mitchell Barak has been called "one of Israel's savviest pollsters" by the Washington Times. His opinions and surveys are regularly quoted in leading publications like the Wall Street Journal, New York Times, Financial Times, Economist, Newsweek, Los Angeles Times, CS Monitor, Haaretz, BBC, Al Jazeera and many others.

Mitchell has also held a number of appointed positions within the Israeli government. Recently, he was the international media advisor and spokesman for Israeli President Shimon Peres. Previously he served as a speechwriter and communications assistant for Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, and was an adviser to Finance Ministers Yaakov Neeman and Dan Meridor. Additionally, Mitchell worked as an aide to Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in the Foreign Ministry and in Prime Minister's Office during the tenure of Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir.

A polling tech entrepreneur, he co-founded MOBOPINIONS, a technology start-up that has developed an innovative platform for polling, profiling and targeting mobile phone users. In the past three years he has fielded more than 4 million survey research questions in 160 different countries.

A New York native, Mitchell holds a BA degree in Political Science and Psychology from George Washington University in Washington, DC. He lives with his wife and their seven children in Jerusalem. His hobbies are running, biking, photography and music, but he enjoys fatherhood and husbandry most.

International Toast Rotary Club of San Juan, Puerto Rico

During the coming calendar week, November 19 to 25 John F. Kennedy was assassinated and Anwar Sadat addressed the Knesset, besides other events:





- On November 19, 1493 Christopher Columbus discovers Puerto Rico, on his 2nd voyage
- On November 20, 1977 Egyptian President Anwar Sadat becomes the 1st Arab leader to address Israeli Knesset. He had arrived in Israel the day before
- On November 21, 1806 Decree of Berlin: Emperor Napoleon I bans all trade with Britain. Little did he know that more than 200 years later Britain is in turmoil again about trade with Europe due to Brexit
- On November 22, 1963 American President John F. Kennedy assassinated by Lee Harvey Oswald in Dallas, Texas
- On November 23, 1921 US President Warren G. Harding signs Willis Campell Act (anti-beer bill) forbidding doctors prescribing beer or liquor for medicinal purposes
- On November 24, 1936 German pacifist Carl von Ossietzky is awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for uncovering German re-armament violating the Versailles agreement

We are toasting this week the Rotary Club of San Juan, Puerto Rico o its discovery by Christopher Columbus. The RC of San Juan was founded in 1918, the oldest Rotary Club in Latin America. It has 133 plus members and is meeting Tuesdays for lunch.







Originally populated by the indigenous Taíno people, the island of Puerto Rico was claimed in 1493 by Christopher Columbus for Spain during his second voyage. Later it endured invasion attempts from the French, Dutch, and British. Four centuries of Spanish colonial government influenced the island's cultural landscapes with waves of African slaves, Canarian, and Andalusian settlers. In 1898, following the Spanish-American War, the United States acquired Puerto Rico under the terms of the Treaty of Paris. Puerto Ricans are by law citizens of the United States and may move freely between the island and the mainland. As it is not a state, Puerto Rico does not have a vote in the United States Congress, which governs the territory with full jurisdiction under the Puerto Rico Federal Relations Act of 1950.
